We will have a technician in place ready to answer application questions or problems for the W4IKS or W7OSM programs. We will have manuals and submittal data ready shortly and we expect to be shipping software within a few days of the receipt of an order. The transition will include the training of our pro-

grammer and we expect to have Mike available to us for the next six months on an as needed basis.

We believe that with our 20 year connection with Wapiti, this will be a smooth transition and eagerly look forward to the future as the Wapiti software supplier.

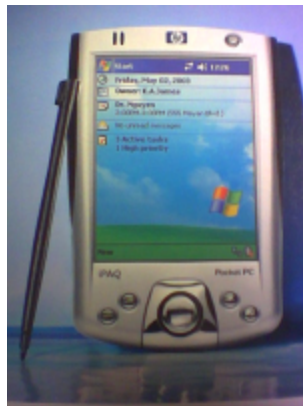
New Products!

There are several new products that are ready to be marketed. We are very excited about a CPU replacement for the 2070L controller that Safetran has developed called a PC104. We have developed an enhanced Wapiti program for the PC104 which will have identical keystrokes to the W4IKS.

In addition to the new Traffic View 2 for Windows, we are already starting to market the new Traffic View software

for the Palm Top PC that permits interface with 170 controllers operating W4IKS and W7OSM software. Upload, download and observe are all standard features of this program.

Other software is under development for the anticipated release of new advanced controllers in the future.

Wapiti Micro Systems is now owned by the Durgin family. In 1889, Robert Durgin started in the traffic industry as a salesman for Crouse Hinds. His success with Crouse Hinds led him to a Crouse Hinds distributor in the Cleveland, Ohio area. Shortly thereafter, in 1976, Robert started his own traffic distributorship and maintenance company. Traffic Control Products is now one of the largest Wapiti /Safetran dealers in the country. Robert is in charge of sales and his wife Lorie is in charge of the finances/ accounting department.
